Historical report:

Zenoma was drawn during a month working all day, stopping only for eating and sleeping. The technique used was pencil, then ink... in DIN A2 sized technical drawing CANSON paper, yes, that's quite big. Gray pattern tones were planned to be applied but Mick lacked the time... It's creation was intended to compete to earn a prize in a comic book competition convoked in a Earthian state (well, we still call then countries) Mick resided.

It doesn't won any prize in money, but it received a special mention and was published in the anthology of that year competition with the winners and so forth. It was presented to the competition unfinished, lacking the tones, the last day by Mick in person, who traveled in train a two hours go journey and another two hours return journey in train.
